RULES & REGULATIONS

The 'Show Organiser' as referred to is South View Equestrian Centre Ltd.

The Show Organiser/Show Manager/Staff/Volunteers/Officials do not accept liability for any accident, damage, injury, theft or illness occasioned to any horse, pony, rider, owner, groom, spectator, nor to any other person nor animal, nor occurring to property, whatsoever, directly or indirectly at or in connection with the Show

Competitions - The Show Organiser reserves the right to cancel/amend or change any competition structure with prior permission where appropriate from British Showjumping.

In accordance with rules 72.3 (a) and (b) The Show Organiser retains the right to decline/exclude or remove any person/persons or animals from the show or future shows without being required to assign reason or being liable for any compensation.

Collecting Rings- All warming up and exercise must be carried out only in the designated areas provided; only combinations entered in the current class will be allowed to use these areas. Standing is not allowed in the collecting rings and riders must ride in single file in the direction instructed on the day. One helper per combination is allowed, who must be appropriately dressed. No bags etc. to be set down anywhere in the warming up areas.

Smoking- Is strictly forbidden in the stable area and in all buildings, including the covered arenas.

Refunds for class entries will be made strictly in accordance with British Showjumping Rule 79.5.1.

There will be no refund on stabling and hook up for cancellations made after the published closing date, regardless of circumstance, and a Vet certificate

All cancellation must be made in person (i.e. \underline{not} by leaving answering machine messages) or by receipted email. $\underline{\underline{Dishonoured\ cheques'}}$. There will be a standing charge of £20 for each dishonoured payment and for accounts not fully settled at the end of the show day. All costs incurred by the Show Organiser in recovery of outstanding sums will be payable, including legal fees and interest will be payable daily at 8% over the then current RBS base rate.

Prizes/Prize Giving- In the event of insufficient starters lower prizes may be withheld in accordance with Rule 76.6. The Show Organiser reserves the right to withhold prize money from any person not attending the prize giving presentation at the end of the Class Rugs, other than any as may be awarded in the class, may not be worn during prize giving.

<u>Dogs-</u> if well behaved, are permitted in all areas <u>except the café.</u> Dogs must be kept on a short lead at all times and must not be allowed to foul the

premises. A £10 fine will apply for any waste not bagged and binned immediately. Any loose dogs will be captured and delivered to the local dog pound. The person responsible for the dog at the show will be fully liable for any damage, loss or injury occurring as a result of a loose or inadequately tended dog. Objections—must be formally made in writing to the Show Secretary in complete accordance with British Showjumping Rule 198.

Stallions-No person shall allow a Stallion for which he/she is responsible as an owner /lessee/authorised agent or rider to compete in any class without taking adequate precautions to ensure other persons and animals are not put at risk or injury. It is the owner and/or handler's responsibility to ensure that stallions are secure in stabling allocated and they supply any restraint necessary.

Vehicles- The Show Organiser reserve the right to remove any vehicle which is causing obstruction even if locked or unattended. Caravans and camping are

Close of entries- Entries and stable reservations close at noon of the day published in the schedule and entry form, or when fully subscribed

Fire- It is recommended that all horseboxes /trailers are fitted with a fire extinguisher of not less than 1 kilo capacity

Farrier & Vet- the services of a Farrier & Vet on call are available at the show via contact with the Secretary's Office; owners or person responsible for the animal/animals will be liable to cost at the time

Any Person misbehaving or causing damage or disruption will be required to leave the Showground immediately.

Class 1 Springboard 128cms/138cms Restricted Handicap

For registered ponies not exceeding 138cms, to be ridden by Junior or Junior Associate Members, ages in accordance with Rule 77.12 & 77.13.

This competition is open to all but for qualification purposes the following applies:

In the 128cms Section Pony riders are eligible to enter, irrespective of notional winnings, before the calendar year in which the age of ten years is reached. Riders who reach the age of ten years and over in the current calendar year, must not have won a total of £500 Notional Winnings In the 138cms Section Pony riders are eligible to enter, irrespective of notional winnings, before the calendar year in which the age of twelve is reached. Riders who reach the age of twelve years and over in the current calendar year, must not have won a total of £850 notional Winnings.

Pony Riders are not eligible to enter the 138cms section until the calendar year in which their eighth birthday is reached. 128cms Ponies are not permitted to enter the 138cms Section.

Once Riders have competed at, or have 'ever' qualified for RIHS or HOYS on any height pony they are no longer eligible to compete in the Final. Table A Two Rounds not against the clock. All equal first in Round one will go forward to Round Two over a shortened course
