Withdrawals must be notified as soon as possible and no refund will be given. Riders and mounts may be substituted up until 12 noon on Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> Septemer A late substitution may be accepted at the organiser's discretion and a fee of £5 is payable per amendment.

The organisers have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective <u>everyone</u> must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring. Anyone behaving in a manner likely to endanger themselves or others will be required to leave the showground immediately.

All instructions and signs must be obeyed - these are for your own safety and to ensure your enjoyment.

The collecting ring is for the purpose of warming up for a class only. It is strictly not a viewing, tacking up or standing area, nor is it to be used by anyone other than those entered in the current class and yet to complete their round. Entry into the collecting ring will be limited to the next two teams. If you have a horse or pony requiring a longer period of warm up please consult with the stewards at the show.

No dogs allowed whatsoever in the café or patio area and elsewhere must be kept on a short lead at all times. All fouling must be picked up, securely wrapped and disposed of in the large blue unit adjacent to the indoor building.

Horse/ponies must not be left unattended when tied to the outside of wagons or trailers. If your animal will not stand in the wagon or trailer, please reserve a stable accordingly.

Animals must not be tied to fences, trees, barriers etc around the showground. No erection of temporary fencing or 'corals' permitted.

No erection of tents permitted.

In accordance with national legislation, we have a no smoking policy in place within the building.

Eat in and takeaway food and refreshment will be available at the café throughout the event. Own cooking/barbecues not permitted outside of horseboxes and own food not allowed in the café or patio seating areas.

Please do not muck out onto the car park.

Lorries must be parked within the designated parking area and must not block general entrances, horse routes or fire exits or any other marked location.

#### **Specific Rules for NSEA Competitions**

#### ARENA EVENTING RULES - (Jumping with Style)

#### **TEAM & INDIVIDUAL QUALIFIERS / CHAMPIONSHIPS**

NSEA JwS Rules (as follows) plus British Eventing Rules 2014

1. This competition is run on the lines of B.E JAS competitions. The main difference is that the emphasis is more on the rider's style and effectiveness, and the harmony between horse and rider at school level. The style mark for the horse does not apply in Schools' Competitions, so the horse's ability has less influence in the marks.

2.The 30cm Rule - A combination of horse/pony & rider cannot qualify at a height which is 30cm lower than that at which they have previously competed (1<sup>st</sup> round height) in any competition (not just NSEA competitions). Any combination of horse and rider that qualifies at one height, and then competes at a height 30cm higher than that qualification height in any competition (not just NSEA competitions), will forfeit their qualification. This restriction does not apply to Open or Advanced Open qualifications. (If you jump 1.3m you wouldn't forfeit a 1m qualification) This rule does apply across disciplines. That is, if you jump at 1.10m you cannot jump at 80cm on the same horse/pony in either Arena Eventing or Show Jumping.

3. Team & Individual

Mini	70-75cm	<ul> <li>Riders minimum age 8yrs on 1<sup>st</sup> Jan 2014, maximum U14 on 1<sup>st</sup> Jan 2014. Horse/Rider combination not to have jumped in ANY affiliated or unaffiliated 1m SJ or Arena Eventing (JwS) classes.</li> <li>Riders jumping in ANY 1m classes or above are not eligible to compete in mini qualifiers. 30cm Rule applies.</li> </ul>
Novice	80-85cm	Age – U19 on 1 <sup>st</sup> Jan 2014. Open to combinations of horses and riders who have not completed at BE pre-novice or higher or Badminton Grass Roots 90 Final. 30cm Rule applies.
Intermediate	90-95cm	Age – U19 on 1 <sup>st</sup> Jan 2014. Open to all except horse/rider combinations that have completed at BE JRN Champs, Junior or Pony Final Trials & Champs or Badminton Grass Roots 100 Final. 30cm Rule applies.
Open	1m-1.05m	Age – U19 on 1 <sup>st</sup> Jan 2014. Open to all

Championships – all courses will be raised a further 5cm at the Championships.

4. The competition begins with a show jumping round started by a bell. The rider completes the show jumping section, then passes through a timing beam into the x.c. phase (which has an optimum time) and completes the x.c. phase, which will include angled rails, arrowheads and other simulated XC fences. This all takes place in one arena.

5. Arena Eventing is an Eventing Competition The winner will be the person / team with the combination of the fewest penalties once the following four components have been added together:

- SJ jumping penalties

- XC jumping penalties

- XC time penalties

- overall style penalties (awarded for both SJ & XC phases combined)

THEREFORE – a team can be placed with fences down, ahead of a team which has jumped clear rounds. As this is an Eventing competition, much more is taken into consideration that simply jumping clear.

6. Style mark – for horse/rider combination, including the position and effectiveness of the rider, with the ability to show a difference between the SJ and XC phase, through their style of riding. This will be judged by an accredited trainer or an elite rider.

7. The aim of the competition is to achieve the fewest penalties from the total of the four components – SJ penalties, XC penalties, Style and XC speed (as close to the optimum time as possible). Some XC fences have a knock down top rail. If this is knocked down, 4 penalties will be added to the penalty score.

8. Dress

XC colours to be worn – including body protector & skull cap to comply with BE Rules. Hats may be tagged by either BE or Pony Club. Hair to be worn above the collar. Gloves should be worn. No earrings or other visible piercings.

9. There will be a 2 minute warning given to riders not ready to jump, before elimination.

10. In the event of a tie, the competitor with the highest style mark (fewest style penalties) will be the winner. If still equal, the one closest to the optimum time will be the winner.

11. All team members are automatically eligible for individual placings, except at the NSEA Championships where Individuals must have pre-qualified.

#### NSEA DRESSAGE RULES

British Dressage Rules 2014 for (tests, tack etc) and NSEA Rules 2014

Criteria for Individual Qualifying Classes

#### Preliminary (prelim)

Prelim qualifying classes shall be split into 'restricted' and 'open' sections.
 Prelim Sec A - Restricted
Riders - who have not ridden at British Dressage Elementary level or above
Horses - with 49 BD points or less

 Prelim Sec B - Open
 Horses- open to horses with any number of points
Riders – who have competed at B.D.Elementary level or above and also combinations of 'restricted' riders on 'open' horses

#### Novice

4. Novice Sec A – Restricted.
Horses with 124 British Dressage points or fewer Rider - any grade.
5. Novice Sec B Open – Open to all.

Please note – If the above "Restricted" criteria is exceeded, following qualification, by either the rider or horse, the combination would then have to compete in the "Open" section at the Championships and if part of a team would have to do the Novice test.

#### 6. Elementary

No restrictions on horse or rider

Tests at Championship Qualifiers- (Team & Individual) 2014 as follows.. Prelim= P 12 (2005) Novice = N 24 (2010) Elementary = E 42 (2008)

Championship Individual Tests = Prelim 19, Novice 39, Elementary 53, Medium 69 Championship Team Tests 2014 as follows... Team Tests = Prelim 15 (up to two riders) Novice 35 (up to two riders)

At qualifiers for individual classes, if there are fewer than 5 riders then the first placed rider only will qualify unless the second placed rider achieves a score of 65% or above, in which case they will also qualify. If there are 6 competitors or more, two riders will qualify per section.

#### Criteria for Team classes

8. Teams shall be made up of 3 or 4 riders, best 3 scores to count. The two prelim riders must be from the prelim 'restricted' class. No prelim open horse or open rider is eligible to compete in the prelim section of the team class. The novice test riders can be either 'restricted' or 'open'.

The top two teams will qualify for the Championships.

9. The results at the Championships will be calculated using Nations Cup criteria (see FEI website)

## NSEA SHOW JUMPING RULES

### **TEAM & INDIVIDUAL QUALIFIERS / CHAMPIONSHIPS**

British Show Jumping Rules 2013-14 (also see NSEA Rules 2013-14)

1. Mini (70-75cm) Riders to be Under 14 on 1st January 2014.

2. The 30cm Rule - A combination of horse/pony & rider cannot qualify at a height which is 30cm lower than that at which they have previously competed (1<sup>st</sup> round height) in any competition (not just NSEA competitions). Any combination of horse and rider that qualifies at one height, and then competes at a height 30cm higher than that qualification height in any competition (not just NSEA competitions), will forfeit their qualification. This restriction does not apply to Open or Advanced Open qualifications. (If you jump 1.30m you wouldn't forfeit a 1m qualification) This rule does apply across disciplines. That is, if you jump at 1.10m you cannot jump at 80cm on the same horse/pony in either Arena Eventing or Show Jumping.

3. Qualifiers shall be run as single phase competitions. Heights in the first part of the round shall be as follows, and can be raised by 5cm in the jump off phase:

Mini –	70cm	(team & individual)
Novice –	80cm	(team & individual)
Intermediate -	90cm	(team & individual)
Open –	1m	(team & individual)
Advanced Open -	1.10m	(individual)

4. There will be a 1.10m team competition at the Championships for riders who have qualified in 1m & 1.10 classes. These qualifications may be held in either Show Jumping or Arena Eventing.

5. Heights will be raised a further 5cm in each round at the Championships.

#### RULES THAT APPLY TO ALL DISCIPLINES - SHOW JUMPING, DRESSAGE AND ARENA EVENTING (JwS)

#### RULES THAT APPLY TO ALL DISCIPLINES

#### Show Jumping, Dressage and Arena Eventing (JwS) for qualifying rounds and the Championships

1. Balloting. If entries at Qualifiers are over subscribed, balloting out will take place in the following order:  $\Box$  1) Entries that are received after the 'entries closure' date and any entry without the current NSEA Membership number correctly quoted.  $\Box$  2) Third teams per school per class, and those from the same school who are entered only as individuals in that class. 3) Second teams per school per class.  $\Box$  4) First teams per school per class, and remaining individuals who are not part of a team.

In the event that any one of the above exclusions reduces eligible entries to the class to below the number of maximum entries allowed, the Show Organiser will draw names out of a hat from those who were previously ineligible, to fill the class.

2. The highest placed 2 teams and 2 individuals will qualify for the Championships. If they are unable to go to the Championships or have already qualified, the qualification will be passed down the line on the day (this can be offered down as far as 6th place at the judges' discretion.)

3. A school may qualify 2 teams for the Championships per class, but may only qualify 1 team per class per competition. No school sashes to be worn at prize giving (sponsor's request).

4. Should a school have two teams placed in the top 2 in a qualifying class, the next placed team down the line may qualify for the Championships, at the judge's discretion, (3rd place) or if any of the first 2 teams have already qualified 2 teams.

5a. Each team at the Championships must include two out of the original qualified four horse/rider combinations. A Team Manager may then have up to 2 wild card substitutions providing they fulfill the following criteria and all other restrictions listed in these rules:  $\Box$  a) The substitute horse/rider combination must have successfully completed a NSEA Competition in the same year or a B.E, BS or Pony Club competition, at the same level or above.

b. A team may qualify with a team of only 3 riders, then take a fourth as 1 wild card, providing they fulfill the above criteria (see a)  $\Box$  c) If a team rider is eliminated at a qualifier and their team goes on to qualify, they may not compete at the Championships unless they successfully complete at another competition, at the same level or above and their entry is sent with an authorising letter from their Team Manager.

6. Objections must be made by the Team Manager only, within 5 minutes of the end of the class, in writing, with a £20 deposit. Video/photographic evidence should not be included in these objections.

7. Only the Team Manager (Team Trainer, Supporting Teacher, Riding Captain or the appointed responsible adult for that school) of each school is to deal with the Secretary for declarations, enquiries, objections etc.

8. Declarations are to be made 10 minutes before the start of each class, by the Team Manager. No changes after the start of the class.

9. For confirmation of entries at qualifiers and Championships, please check the NSEA website. If you do not wish for your child's name to be posted on the website, please write on your entry form and confirm with the secretary.

10. At the Championships, the height of the fences shall be raised 5cms from the qualifying height in each round, at the course builder's discretion.

#### 11. RIDERS

i) All riders must be in full time education at the school or college they represent in 2014 (age U19 on 1st Jan 2014) with the following exceptions :-  $\Box a$ ) A rider who changes schools in 2014 can only then compete for their new school, unless they qualified with their previous school, for the 2014 Championships, prior to moving schools, in which case, they can represent their previous school, but only at the Championships, with the Head Teacher of the previous School's permission.

b) If a rider qualifies for one school, then changes school, they may ride at the Championships for the original school (see "a" above) unless they also qualify, in the same class, for their new school, in which case they must compete for the new school.  $\Box$ 

c) If a rider has changed schools since originally qualifying, they may compete for their old school at the Championships (see "a" above) and also qualify for other classes for their new school. However, a rider may only compete for one school per class at the Championships.

d) Once a rider leaves a school, they may no longer compete for that school (except at the Championships as detailed in "a" above) and may not compete for their new school until they are enrolled at that school, and the School Year has started.

ii) A rider may not compete in both 70 & 1m classes.

iii) Combinations of horse and rider may only compete in 2 teams per discipline per qualifier.  $\Box$  iv) A rider may only compete once in any team, therefore cannot compete two horses in the same team.  $\Box$  v) If a horse/rider combination wins an individual class at the Championship, they may compete in a team at a lower height the following year, but are unable to qualify individually for any height lower than the one at which they won.  $\Box$  vi) At Qualifiers the scores of all team competitors, obtained whilst riding as a team member, will automatically also count as their individual score when determining the individual placings. (Top 2 teams & individual Sto qualify). If classes are deemed too large, the Show Organiser may split the class into two sections. The first placed team & individual ONLY will then qualify from each section. At the NSEA Championships, where all individuals must have pre qualified to compete as individuals, the dressage team & individual competitions will be run as separate classes. In the jumping classes, if riders have qualified as both a team member and as an individual for the Championships (in the same class), their team score will count as their individual score and they will jump only once.  $\Box$  vi) The minimum age for a child to compete in any NSEA qualifier is 8 yrs of age on JAN 1st 2014. They must have successfully completed an NSEA competition (CC / RPL / CchQ) or similar prior to entry for a Qualifier.

#### 12. HORSES

- a) A horse may only compete once in each class and therefore, no horse may be ridden by two different riders in the same class.
- b) A horse may compete in a maximum of two classes per discipline, at each qualifier.
- c) Any horse competing at Open (1m-1.05m) may not also compete in the Mini class.
- d) Horses to be plaited at the Championships.
- 13. The Show Organisers' and judges reserve the right to penalize, by elimination, any of the following:  $\Box$
- a) Any rider they feel to be unsafe or using unnecessary force.  $\Box$

b) Any horse that looks unsound or unduly distressed or poses a danger to anyone.

c) Outside assistance which may benefit the rider unfairly.  $\Box d$ ) Any rider or parent or team manager who is rude or abusive to any Competition official or helper.

14. Serious cases of misconduct will be reported to the NSEA directly, where further action may be taken.

15. Any horse and rider combination in any Show Jumping or Arena Eventing class, which has represented their country in an International Competition, may only compete as an Individual in Open or Advanced Open Classes and will forfeit any previously held Individual

Championship qualifications which are not in Open or Advanced Open Classes. However, they may still compete as a part of a Team at 90cm (or above) providing they comply with the "30cm rule".

Any horse and rider combination in any Dressage class, which has represented their country in an International Competition, may only compete at Novice (section depending on BD points), Elementary or Medium level.
